Building Healthy Families: As we begin perhaps the most important days of the church year, remember that Holy Week can be a confusing time for young children. Take them with you to all the special services this week but don't assume they know what you know. They may wonder, "What does Maundy mean?" :Why does everyone at church seem so sad and quiet?" read John 18 - 19 aloud with them. As you reflect on feelings of fear and sadness at Jesus' brutal treatment, crucifixion, and death, share His message of hope and promise from John 14: 1-3. Remind them (and your self!)what while Good Friday is dark and scary, it's not the end - only the beginning of the sotry. Remind them we're Easter people and Resurrection Sunday is coming!!

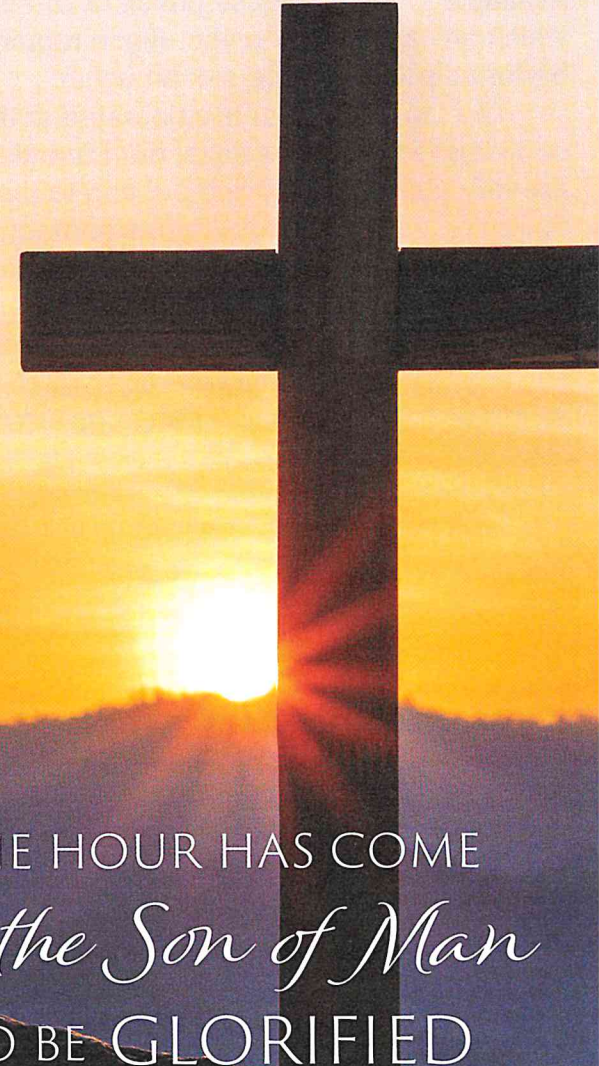
