Thanks to HB 1176 passed by the State Legislature, you can save up to 50% or up to \$2500, whichever is less, on your ND Income Tax bill if you donate to Dakota Hope in 2024. This became effective during the 2023 tax year and is on-going for future years. This is a tax credit, not a deduction.


